Dear Westholme Family,

Everyone in the Westholme family is incredibly proud of our students today. They coped admirably with the pressures of their first public examinations and we are delighted with the results of their dedication. We mustn't forget that they started their Secondary lives amid Covid and lockdown restrictions, and required a great deal of resilience to get through that experience.

Results improved at every grade in comparison to 2023, with the percentage of 9s awarded at Westholme almost double that of the previous year. One third of pupils achieved 5 or more results at 9-7 grades, the old A*-A grades. But what matters to me most is what every child achieves and whether they are exceeding their supposed potential. What we're seeing again is very strong value-added.

For our students, the basic building blocks are now in place, and we expect them to thrive in the academic side of life in the Westholme INSPIRED Sixth Form as well as continue to commit to their all-round development through our extensive co-curricular programme.

GCSEs can be a "Jack of all trades" trial for many students whereas the Sixth Form allows them for the first time to choose the subjects that most inspire them and, ultimately, will determine their career pathways. What lies ahead will bring its challenges but will also be far more exciting than what came before.

The marks add up for Will


The results certainly add up for Will – who achieved 9s in Science and Maths, five 8s and two 7s.

Oliver balances exams and cricket with aplomb



Zain hits top marks in GCSE success.


Congratulations to Zain who has achieved six 9s, including Maths and Further Maths, in his GCSEs.

Ibrahim exceeds his own expectations


GCSE results day has been all smiles for Ibrahim after he exceeded his own expectations.
