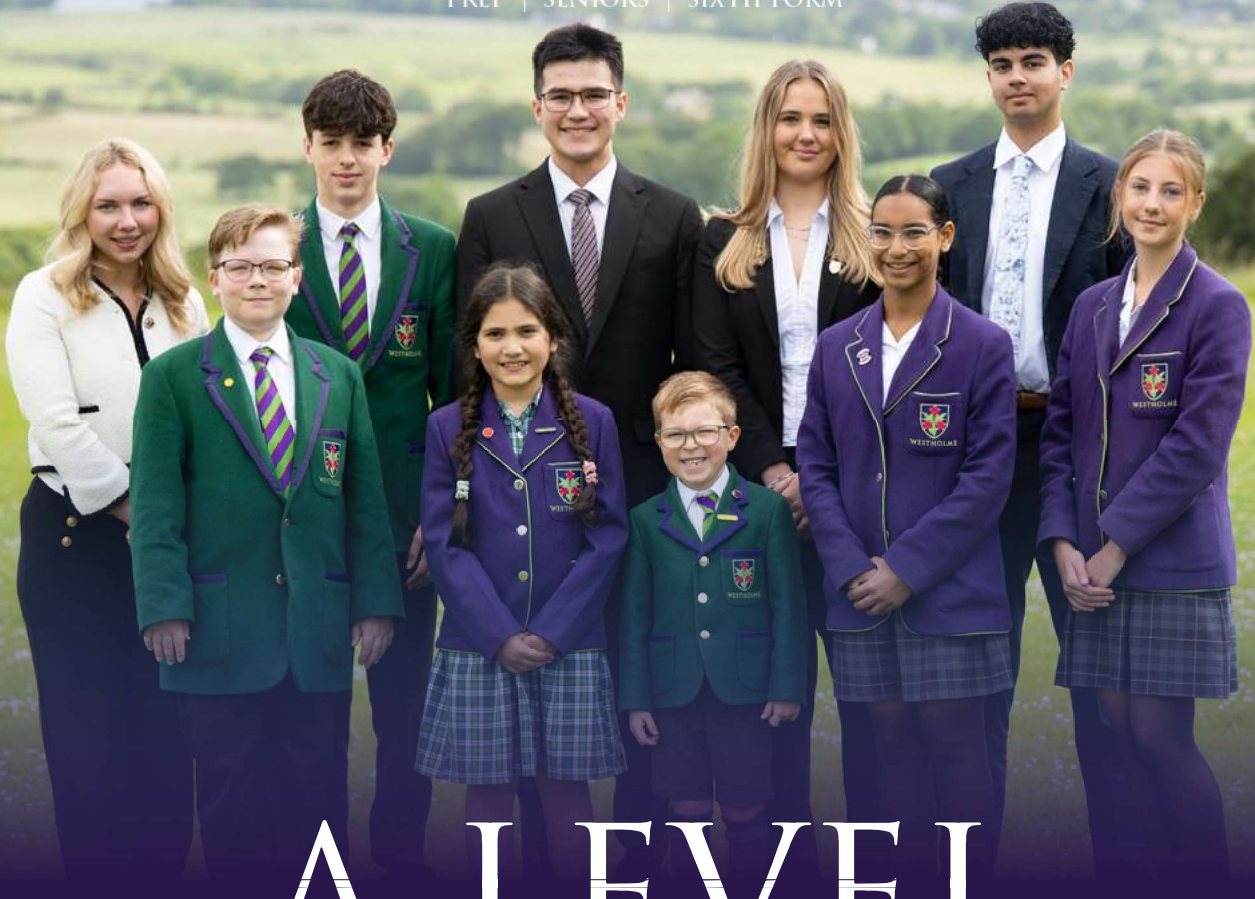

Dear Westholme Families,

Many congratulations to every member of our Year 13 cohort who received their A Level results yesterday.

This year's A Level results are a tremendous achievement for our students and a proud moment for the entire Westholme community.

With 79% of entries achieving A*-B grades and 45% securing A*-A grades, these results demonstrate the academic ambition and commitment of an exceptional group of young people. We are particularly proud to see Art, English Literature, Further Mathematics, Computer Science, EPR, Geography, Politics, Sociology and Drama each achieving a 100% A*-B pass rate.

Yet results day is about far more than grades alone. My thanks must also go to our dedicated teaching and pastoral staff, whose expertise, encouragement and belief in our young people have supported them throughout their Sixth Form journey, and to our families for their continued support.

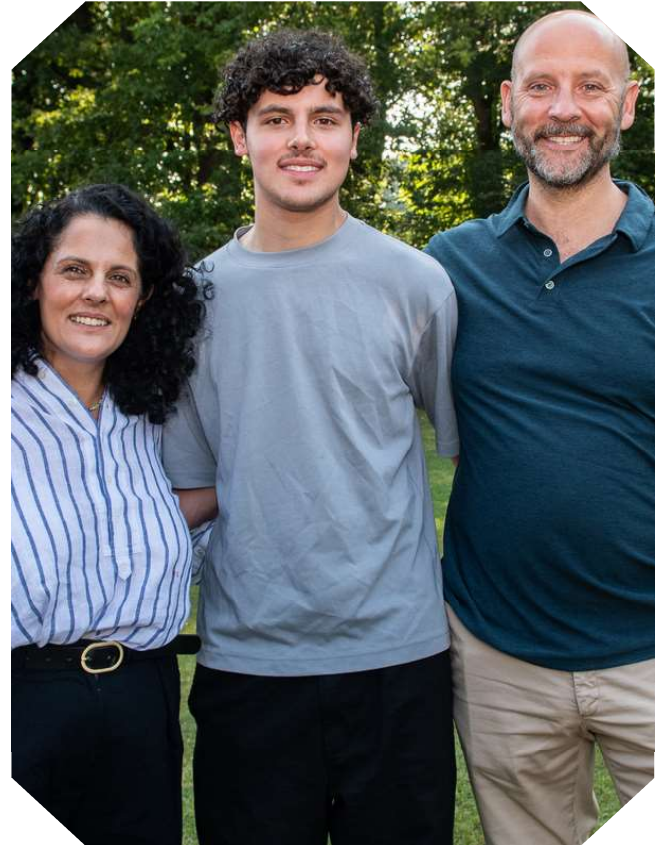
ZAIN COMBINES MATHEMATICAL TALENT WITH CODING AMBITION

Figure skater Setareh has brought determination, curiosity and leadership to every aspect of her Westholme Sixth Form experience.

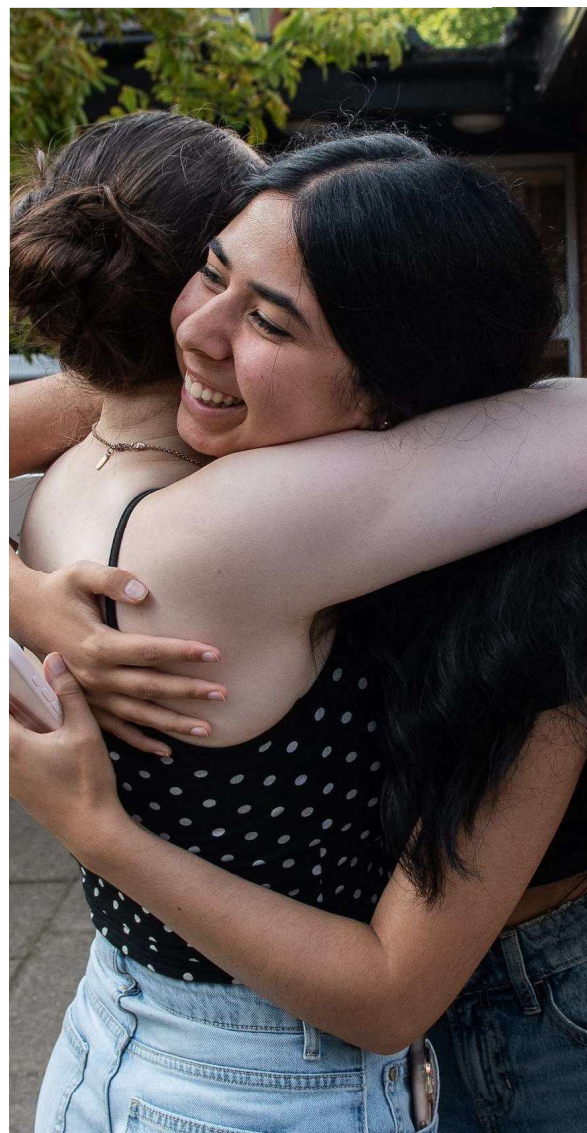
